The Council of Bishops has called a Special Session of the General Conference of The United Methodist Church to be held February 23-26, 2019 in St. Louis, Missouri. The purpose will be to receive and act on a report from the Commission on a Way Forward based on the recommendations of the Council of Bishops. The 32-member Commission was authorized by General Conference 2016 and appointed by the Council of Bishops to examine paragraphs in The Book of Discipline concerning human sexuality and exploring options to strengthen the unity of the church.

"Ash Wednesday marks the first day, or the start of the season of Lent, which begins 40 days prior to Easter (Sundays are not included in the count). This year Ash Wednesday falls on <u>March 6</u>.

Lent is a time when many Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, moderation and spiritual discipline. During some Ash Wednesday services, the Pastor will lightly rub the sign of the cross with ashes onto the foreheads of worshipers. The practice of repentance and mourning in ashes is found in 2 Samuel 13:19; Esther 4:1; Job 2:8; Daniel 9:3; and Matthew 11:21. (From www.umcdiscipleship.org)

# A WORD FROM OUR PASTOR



The 2019 Special Session of the General Conference will be held February 23-26, 2019 in St. Louis, Missouri, and I ask that we all be in prayer for our denomination. Here are some questions and answers put out by the church. As always, if you have any questions, do not hesitate to contact me or our Lay Leader, Amy Astin.

### What is General Conference?

Every four years, United Methodists from around the world assemble as the General Conference and connect in worship, prayer, Communion, fellowship – and the legislative work that shapes our shared life. General Conference delegates confer and vote on proposals for resourcing and regulating the life and work of The United Methodist

Church. General Conference sets the rules and establishes procedures for virtually every aspect of the church's life. It also communicates the denomination's official position on a variety of issues and cultural challenges. General Conference makes binding decisions related to the connectional and missional life of The United Methodist Church. It is the only body authorized to speak for or as The United Methodist Church.

### Why was this special session called?

The special session in February 2019 is to focus on the issue of human sexuality and church unity with the goals of ending distracting and mission-compromising disagreement about how to be in ministry with LGBTQI (Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer or Questioning, and Intersex) people. The hope is that decisions made will allow the 2020 General Conference to focus on mission and the next steps for the church's unified global witness.

### How might this General Conference change the structure of the global church?

The structure of the church could change in several ways. Those possibilities listed here are as outlined in the Commission on a Way Forward report to General Conference and are subject to change by the General Conference.

- The One Church Plan (OCP) makes no significant change to church structure; however, this plan would amend the Book of Discipline's language about incompatibility with Christian teaching and marriage defined as a union between a man and a woman. They would allow annual conferences to determine whether to ordain LGBTQI clergy and allow individual churches to vote whether to perform same-sex marriages in their buildings. They also would clarify that no clergy would be required to perform a same-sex marriage and would allow them to transfer or be reassigned if their beliefs conflict with those of their churches.
- The Connectional Conference Plan (CCP) would create three values-based connectional conferences. Jurisdictional conferences and annual conferences in the United States would vote to join one of the new conferences. Central conferences could join one of the new conferences or form another connectional conference. Bishops and clergy would associate with at least one connectional conference. Several constitutional amendments would be required to implement this plan.
- The Traditional Plan leaves the language of the current Book of Discipline and increases accountability to the Discipline. A church or annual conference that differs in its beliefs about sexuality would be allowed to leave the denomination to form its own "self-governing Methodist church," and clergy would be allowed to transfer to those churches.


# Warm Up Sunday
