Pastor's Page



According to the Old Farmer's Almanac, the year 2021 begins a new decade because today's Gregorian calendar counts decades starting with the first year 1 CE. I am bringing this up because I want to correct myself; I told you last year (2020) that we are in a new decade. (I know none of you remember that.) But a stronger reason behind it is my desire to start anew and get us moving in the right direction.

'Moving in the right direction' means we draw closer to God and draw closer to one another. Imagine God is in the center and we all are circled around God. In Christianity we believe as we draw

closer to God, we draw closer to one another. You have also heard of the vertical and horizontal nature of our faith like the cross. The vertical nature here means our relationship with God and the horizontal nature meaning our relationship with others. Often we mistakenly think when we take care of our horizontal part of faith, the vertical part would take care of itself. Or we even think that both will develop and strengthen together simultaneously and concurrently. I am from the school of thought that the vertical part must take the lead. I am not saying that the vertical nature is the only important part, like hermits and other ascetics, but what I am saying is that it should come first and take the lead in everything we do.



This year I would really like us, as a church and as a body of Christ, to focus on worship and be able to say concretely these are the ways we strengthened our worship in 2021. This is not to say our worship is sub-standard right now but to say there is always room to grow. Each Sunday this year I have had, and will continue to have, a teaching moment on worship in which I will introduce an idea about worship for us to mull over. I want you to do it and share your feedback with me. I really want our church to worship in truth and in spirit.

I am reading the Bible through again this year and it is amazing how the Israelites are instructed to offer the best sacrifice to God with the right heart. That is what God asks of us. What does that mean for you? What does it look like? What does that mean for Second Avenue? What does that look like? Let's envision or visualize it in our head and let's dream together about it. Most of all, let's do it together!

Lent: Preparing for New Life

Ash Wednesday marks the first day, or the start of the season of Lent, which begins 40 days prior to Easter (Sundays are not included in the count). This year Ash Wednesday falls on **February 17**. Lent is a time when many Christians prepare for Easter by observing a period of fasting, repentance, moderation and spiritual discipline.

During some Ash Wednesday services, the Pastor will lightly rub the sign of the cross with ashes onto the foreheads of worshipers.

The practice of repentance and mourning in ashes is found in 2 Samuel 13:19; Esther 4:1; Job 2:8; Daniel 9:3; and Matthew 11:21. (From <u>www.umcdiscipleship.org</u>)
