Important Message from Bishop and Cabinet

Greetings clergy and laity of the North Georgia Conference,

I am Bishop Sue Hauptert-Johnson, and I'm here with the entire Appointive Cabinet today to make an appeal to you and to talk about the next couple of weeks and how we worship in a time of COVID. First, I want to share with you Scripture. This is from the third letter of John, verse two: "Beloved, I pray that all may go well with you, and that you may be in good health just as it is well with your soul." Our goal is that bodies and souls will be healthful this Christmas season.

We don't want to issue edicts. I'll be really upset with any of you who post on social media that it's coming down from on high, and we're forcing your hand, and we are policing this carefully. That is not who we are, nor how we want to be perceived. We are your brothers and sisters in Christ, we have great concern for you, clergy, and your parishioners. And we do not want the church to add to the heartache and the turmoil and the heartbreak of 270,000 families in this country right now.

Around North Georgia, hospitals right now are working on their protocols for what they do if the intensive care beds are full. That gives me great pause and great concern, and it should give you great pause and great concern. If we don't do this right, if we don't avoid gathering and avoid crowds and avoid the spread of COVID, we could not only jeopardize the lives of many who get COVID, but we could also jeopardize the lives of those who would otherwise need those ICU beds. So this is a matter of grave public health importance.

I also say, continue to watch your areas. Most counties in North Georgia are red. Most counties in North Georgia have a widespread incidence of COVID, and it is a very dangerous time. If it gets even worse, and it probably will, as those who have been exposed over Thanksgiving have complications or need higher levels of medical care, please pay attention and watch and hear us, your Bishop and cabinet.

Something I've heard a lot is "but the Baptist church down the street is meeting, but the Catholic church down the street is meeting ..." That should not weigh in your determination. Every time I hear that, and I think about my mother's saying, "Well, if somebody jumps off a cliff, Sue, are you going to follow them?" You need to have your own sense of what is safe and stick to it and be good with that.

Finally, we do not need you to meet as a show of your faith. I trust that you are faithful people. I don't go run across eight lanes of the highway at rush hour to show I'm a faithful Christian. In fact, Jesus said he wasn't real crazy about those public shows of piety. He said, go get in your closet and pray. I invite you, and I thank you in advance for your careful attention to the guidelines, for carefully thinking this out and listening to medical professionals, for having a healthy regard for the real danger that this virus represents, and a healthy sense of better days are on the horizon.

Pastor's Page



As most of you, I missed the Christmas pageant this year with the children. I always enjoy children singing and doing the parts of animals, angels, shepherds, and baby Jesus. I missed hearing “O Holy Night” and spilling wax on my hand as we sing, “Silent Night, Holy Night.”

In this time of pandemic, we are missing and craving for all tangible, physical things—hugs, meals together, sacred space like our sanctuary and Fellowship Hall, etc. We have had to isolate ourselves more than ever before and “Way too long!” you might say. As much as I hate it, I want you to know that it is necessary for the safety of others that we wait a few more months. We can see the finish line! It is more important now that we stay vigilant at the end of this race.

As I write this article, the death toll of COVID 19 is over 343,000 people in the US alone. As a clergy, I cannot help imagining those 343,000 funerals and their family members’ faces. I am grieving for the loss of those people even though I only knew a handful of them and whether you acknowledge it or not, so are you. I came across these words written by Rickie Holter who lost his Dad to Covid. “They buried my Dad this week. Normally, I’d say ‘we’ buried him. But this is nothing like normal. I was 1,300 miles away, working remotely, at my dining room table. My sister, her husband, their son? They stood in a church cemetery in Maryland, socially distanced from the pastor, and the grave itself. My brother and his wife were in the grass on the other side. So were another nephew, and a niece. And my other brother and his wife? They left separate ends of their house, drove separate cars. At the cemetery, he couldn’t do more than crack open his car window. Quarantined. Ten people. One funeral. A pandemic-sized hole in our hearts. See, Dad had COVID-19. They tested him Thursday, April 9, the day his liver gave out, the day half my family made a final visit. He died April 10. The results came back a day later. Positive.” Close your jaws. I am afraid that this is not a unique story. And we all mourn together with those who lost their loved ones. These are deaths on top of those who lost their fight to cancer, heart disease, stroke, Alzheimer’s disease, etc.

One of the dangers of all this is that our isolation can lead us to darkness. Domestic violence is skyrocketing. Alcoholism and addiction are rampant. Children are abused and neglected. Particularly, the elderly have chosen to stay at home, sometimes for months at a time, completely alone. I visited someone in Mableton a few weeks ago. She said that I was the first person she had seen and touched in six months. It seems like darkness is pervasive. I called a friend in Maryland to wish him a Merry Christmas on Christmas Eve. He said, “Is it Christmas Eve today?” Confusion and disorientation are common symptoms of this day and age. That is where you come in. I ask you to check in on our family and friends. It does not matter if they belong to our church. It does not matter if they are rich or poor, Black or White, or Republican or Democrat. Be extra compassionate and kind! Be the light of Jesus.

And you may think I am Peter crying wolf and you are tired of hearing this over and over again, but we will be alright and we will overcome this TOGETHER. The year 2020 has been dark, real dark, but the darkness did not, cannot, and will not overcome God, our love for God and for one another.



Len & Beverly Woodward's daughter Cecilia giving her first COVID-19 vaccine to a fellow nurse.


United Methodist Women News

Psalms: an 8 Week Zoom Bible Study, Starting on Wednesday, January 13 at 6:00pm.

This Bible Study brings our ancestors in the faith to the table where we learn from them in a cross-cultural experience bridging historical and modern day life. This eight-session study of the Book of Psalms masterfully mixes scholarly and practical teaching through the most beloved book in the Old Testament.

The key messages of this study include: *what* the Book of Psalms is (the hymnbook of ancient Israel), *how* it was utilized in Israelite worship (the various "forms" of the Psalms), and *why* the Book of Psalms remains critical to our devotional lives today. It also dives into the concrete realities of Israelite worship (the tabernacle, temple, priesthood, and sacrifice) as well as Israel's theology of worship wrapped up in their theocratic world view.

Experience the Psalms with fresh connections to contemporary worship and devotional practices. Indulge in the Biblical study of the Psalms from a scholar and former pastor, Rev. Dr. Sandra Richter.
