

"Camp Meeting"

In the good ol' days when the south had very few church facilities and even fewer ordained clergy, for the majority of people living outside of cities, the only communal worship service was offered by circuit riders (traveling or itinerant preachers). Occasionally different communities would gather together in one outdoor location and hold revivals and they were called "camp meetings." These camp meetings, lasting several days, were a central feature of the religious life in the South and played a major role in leading people to Christ. Deeply emotional and evangelical, camp meetings are credited with moral reform and the rapid growth of church membership until 1840s when the established meeting-houses (church buildings) began to replace them. In the late 19th century, the movement reappeared in Appalachia as Holiness groups and in the Methodist Church, we revived camp-meetings as a beloved tradition and a time of great spiritual awakening. From July 22 to August 26, we will be having a camp meeting style worship experience. Rev. Millie will be preaching familiar stories from the Bible. We will sing familiar hymns from the Cokesbury hymnal and you are invited to dress more casually during Camp Meeting. It will be a good ol' time! So y'all come and invite your friends and neighbors!

North GA Conference Lay Delegate Report 2018 Tuesday, June 12, 2018 to Thursday, June 14, 2018 Theme: Moving Toward Perfection in Love"

Athens Classic Center 300 N Thomas Street Athens, GA 30601

The conference focused on the practice of spiritual disciplines, including prayer, the study of scripture, fasting, worship, and molding of our souls in Christian community. Bishop Sue Haupert-Johnson presided, making her second Annual Conference as resident bishop in North GA.

Four worship services anchored the conference, each planned by a different team of North GA United Methodists. The first day included Opening Worship with a Service of Remembrance which honored 27 clergy and 14 spouses. The Ordination Service of Licensing, Commissioning, and Ordination, was conducted by Rev. Dr. Byron Thomas and was followed by the Service of Sending Forth.

There were three separate times when Rev. Millie Kim participated in services and we should all be very proud of her performance. Once she spoke about the Spiritual Discipline of Lectio Divina. It's a spiritual discipline that helps you be more attentive to yourself and to others and streamline your life toward God. "It moves us from knowing God awkwardly or casually to knowing God intimately," she said. Rev. Kim led the body in communal Lectio Divina.

The Conference heard several times about the Special Session of General Conference of 2019. On Wednesday, members of the Annual Conference took a poll to gauge the feelings of the body as we look toward the special vote. These polls showed both hope and concern about the future of the church. Bishop Sue said, "I invite you to join me in prayer for our United Methodist Church, our Council of Bishops, our Commission on the Way Forward, and our Judicial Council as we await the Judicial Council decision on whether a gay pastor can serve as bishop. I want you to know that, regardless of what the Judicial Council concludes, it will not be the last word on the denomination's approach to issues regarding human sexuality in the future."

Bishop Sue addressed the Conference on Thursday speaking from her heart about the future of the church. She began by asking all to consider how our decisions will affect people not yet in the church. We know that the church is not of one mind on the matter of human sexuality, and there is not a clear answer to this challenge. But, she continued, "There's too much at stake to draw battle lines. I urge every church to be in conversation."

Through reports and awards, the members saw the reach of the United Methodist connection from our local communities, across our Conference, and around the world. Gifts to the Ministerial Education Fund totaled more than \$74,000 and donations are still incoming. The Annual conference passed a budget of \$21,920,651 for 2018. Keith Cox, Conference Treasurer, shared that in 2017, North GA churches had paid 94.7 percent of the apportionment budget, the highest percentage of apportionments paid in 16 years.
